## SEA FISHERIES ACT, 1992: DETERMINATION OF QUOTA FEES

Under section 20 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act 29 of 1992), and with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, I hereby determine that the fees set out in the Schedule shall be payable in respect of quotas allocated under section 16 of the Act.

Government Notice 233 of 15 December 1995 is hereby withdrawn.

#### **SCHEDULE**

1. In this notice any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act 29 of 1992), shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates -

"hake" means any fish of the species Merluccius capensis or Merluccius paradoxus;

"horse mackerel" means any fish of the genus Trachurus;

"pilchard" means any fish of the species Sardinops ocellata;

"red crab" means any crab of the species Chaceon (Geryon) maritae;

"Namibian vessel" means a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act 57 of 1951);
- (b) which is permanently based in Namibia;
- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which at least 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and
- (e) of which at least 80% of the crew on board at all times while the vessel is operating under the quota, are Namibian citizens;

"Namibian-based vessel" means a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act 57 of 1951);
- (t) which is permanently based in Namibia;

- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which less than 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and
- (e) the crew of which include Namibian citizens, but being less than 80% of the number of the crew;

"foreign vessel" means any fishing vessel which is not a Namibian vessel or a Namibian-based vessel.

2. Every person to whom a quota in respect of any of the species of fish mentioned below has been allocated under section 16 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992, shall pay in respect of every metric ton of the species of fish so allocated the appropriate fee specified below in respect of the species:

## Species of fish

## Fee per metric ton

(a) Hake -

N\$800:

Provided that -

- (i) where hake is caught by means of a Namibian vessel or Namibian-based vessel the following rebates shall be allowed:
  - Namibian vessel

N\$400;

Namibian-based vessel

N\$200;

- (ii) a rebate of N\$ 200 per metric ton of wetfish shall be allowed if landed in Namibia, irrespective of the category of vessel by means of which the hake was caught.
- (b) Horse mackerel, excluding horse mackerel caught by purse seine method -

N\$ 62,55:

Provided that -

(i) where horse mackerel is caught by means of a Namibian vessel or Namibian-based vessel the following rebates shall be allowed:

Namibian vessel

N\$ 31,25;

Namibian-based vessel

N\$ 15,65;

- (ii) a rebate of N\$62,55 per metric ton of horse mackerel shall be allowed if landed in Namibia, irrespective of the category of vessel by means of which the fish was caught.
- (c) Pilchard, allocated for catching -

(i) by means of a Namibian vessel

N\$100;

(ii) by means of a Namibian-based vessel

N\$150:

Provided that in respect of quota allocated for the catching of pilchard for the purpose of processing fishmeal, the fee is

N\$25,00;

(d) Crab [other than spider (stone) crab] or red crab

N\$600:

Provided that -

 (i) where crab is caught by means of a Namibian vessel or Namibian-based vessel the following rebates shall be allowed:

Namibian vessel

N\$300;

Namibian-based vessel

N\$150;

- (ii) a rebate of N\$150 per metric ton of crab shall be allowed if landed in Namibia irrespective of the category of vessel by means of which the fish was caught.
- 3. The quota fee payable in terms of paragraph 2 in respect of the year for which the quota has been allocated shall be paid to the Permanent Secretary: Fisheries and Marine Resources, Private Bag 13355, Windhoek, in four equal instalments calculated in accordance with the formula set out in paragraph 4, which instalments shall be paid not later than -
  - (a) first instalment, 15 March;
  - (b) second instalment; 15 May;
  - (c) third instalment, 15 July; and
  - (d) fourth instalment, 31 December.

4. For the purposes of calculating the amount of the instalments referred to in paragraph 3, the following formula shall be applied:

Q x F

where

the total quota allocation in metric tons;

F = the quota fee applicable in terms of paragraph 2.

5. Each payment made in terms of paragraph 3 shall be accompanied by appropriate documentary proof of the category of vessel used, as well as documentary proof, countersigned by a sea fisheries inspector, verifying the quantity of fish landed in terms of paragraph 2(a)(ii), 2(b)(ii) and 2(d)(ii). Should proof be insufficient, the full fee specified in paragraph 2 in respect of the species of fish, without any rebate, shall be applicable and payable.

## SEA FISHERIES ACT, 1992: IMPOSITION OF LEVIES ON FISH

Under section 25 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act 29 of 1992), and after consultation with the Sea Fisheries Advisory Council, and with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, I hereby impose for the benefit of the Sea Fisheries Research fund a levy on fish, as set out in the Schedule.

#### **SCHEDULE**

1. In this notice, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act 29 of 1992), shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates -

"hake" means any fish of the species Merluccius capensis or para-doxus;

"horse mackerel" means any fish of the genus *Trachurus*;

"pilchard" means any fish of the species Sardinops ocellata;

"West Coast steenbras" also known as "white fish" means any fish of the species Lithognathus aureti;

"blacktail" also known as "dassie" means any fish of the species *Diplodus sargus*;

"snoek" means any fish of the species Thyrsitus atun;

"galjoen" means any fish of the species Coracinus capensis.

2. Every fisher who lands any fish or portions of fish of any of the species mentioned in paragraph 3, shall pay in respect of every metric ton so landed

the appropriate levy prescribed in that paragraph, and in respect of a part of a metric ton, a pro rata portion of the prescribed amount.

- 4. For the purpose of paragraph 3 the mass of any fish shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Sea Fisheries Regulations promulgated under Government Notice 1 of 1993.
- 5. The levy payable in terms of paragraph 3 shall be paid to the Permanent Secretary: Fisheries and Marine Resources, Private Bag 13355, Windhoek, within 7 days from the last day of the month during which the fish has been landed.
- 6. Interest at the rate determined by the Minister of Finance from time to time under section 35(b) of the State Finance Act, 1991 (Act 31 of 1991), shall be payable on late payments.
- 7. Every payment in terms of paragraph 5 shall be accompanied by a statement certified by the fishery control officer referred to in regulation 37 of the Sea Fisheries Regulations showing the mass of each species of fish for which payment is made.
