TURNAROUND TIMES

- For the information of stakeholders, the present status of the typical volumes of various types of cases and the lead times to obtain a set-down date for such cases are given in the table below.
- 2. Practitioners who might experience a materially different turnaround time should inform the Office of the Deputy Judge President with the relevant details so that any anomalies or systemic failures can be identified and remedied. Also, where a difficulty peculiar to that practitioner occurs, that problem can be rectified.
- 3. The correlation between turnaround times, the volume of the caseload and the number of judges available to be rostered is continually monitored so that the optimal utilisation of all resources can be achieved. The full complement of judges is deployed throughout the term and judicial capacity is stretched. The generosity displayed by pro bono volunteers from the legal profession is a

valuable resource upon which reliance is placed to achieve an effective litigation service.

- 4. The lead times achieved are not in all cases thought to be satisfactory. For example, efforts continue to reduce the unopposed motion court lead time to 4 weeks commensurate with the reasonable needs of commercial life.
- 5. The general trial roll is bedevilled by a deluge of Road Accident Fund default judgment cases. To make fair allowance for other types of trials so that they are not unduly delayed by being crowded out by Road Accident Fund default judgment cases, a degree of preference is applied in the set downs. A better solution than at present being applied to RAF litigation is currently being explored.
- 6. A bulletin reflecting the turnaround status as at the beginning of each term shall henceforth be published for the information of the legal profession.
